Why choose an Honours degree:

The HPI School Honours program offers you an extra year of high quality study.

It is the first step to a specialist career in your chosen discipline.

For those who choose not to continue onto a research higher degree, an Honours degree provides a significant competitive edge in the job market.

This stimulating and challenging program will:

- enable you to pursue advanced study in a specialist area in more depth than is possible in an undergraduate degree
- enhance your capacity for independent research
- develop your research skills to the standard required for enrolment in research higher degrees
- encourage you to thrive in small classes in which staff promote vigorous and interactive discussion
- provide you with an excellent basis for entry into Research Higher Degree programs

Entry requirements:

- BA Pass degree or equivalent, with a minimum GPA of 5.5 in a major or an extended major in the relevant discipline (Classical Languages, Ancient History, Studies in Religion, Philosophy or History).
- To study Honours in Philosophy you must also have a pass grade in Introduction to Logic (formerly PHIL1020, now PHIL2110).
- The Ancient History/History Major does not provide entry into Honours in either Ancient History or History.

Duration:

- The Honours program must be completed in one-year of full-time study or two-years of part-time study. Honours can be commenced in Semester 1 or 2 for Classical Languages, Ancient History, History and Philosophy. Studies in Religion commences in Sem 1.

How to apply

- Make an appointment with the Discipline Honours Advisor to discuss your interests, proposed topic and potential Honours supervisor: they will show you the form(s) that must be uploaded online with your application
- Make an appointment to meet with potential Honours supervisor(s) to discuss your research topic
- When you have an agreed topic with your supervisor, make sure that both your supervisor and Discipline Honours advisor have signed the paperwork
